Year 1 – Elsie Cross for fabulous work describing the characters from Lost and Found and Carmen Wan for being a fabulous Mathematician working with tens and units.


Year 2 – Olivia Dos Santos for fabulous challenge maths work on three digit place value & partitioning and Bella Butcher for amazing spelling work.
