Over the last few weeks, each class has been carefully creating two of the scenes from the 'Stations of the Cross'. On Monday, our first day in Holy Week, the stations were set up in our school hall, and Year 3 lead a very reflective walk around each individual station. From Reception to Year 6, the response from our children was incredibly respectful and reflective. Organised by Mrs Woosey, as a school community, it strengthened our understanding of the importance of Holy Week and reminded us of the significance of the Stations of the Cross at this



Year 5 brought our Holy Week to a close today with a thought provoking performance of 'The Three Trees' followed by a reflection of the hymn 'When I survey the Wondrous Cross'. It was a poignant reminder of the simplicity of Jesus's story told through 3 significant trees during his life – a cradle, a boat and a cross. Jesus was born to be a human like us; he calmed the seas to help his friends and he died on the cross – treated like a thief by those that he lived amongst. Despite all that goes on in our busy lives, we can rely on God's love. Easter is the time of year that we remember that God gave his only son as a sign of that love for us all. Easter Sunday Masses at 9:30am in St Teresa's / 11am in St Mary Magdalen's.




