School Drop Off

Can I please remind all parents that we open the school gates at 8.30am for drop off but the children are not allowed into the school until 8.40am. Thank you.

As the government road map is on track, I have been looking at all the Covid measures that I have put in that are beyond the guidance, to decide which it would be sensible at this point to lift. I know we are still getting local cases so I don't think we can afford to be complacent yet but as most staff are now at the second vaccination stage we are feeling much safer. From today there will be no longer a requirement to wear a face mask outside school although please feel free to do so if you wish.

The school guidance says there still has to be some social distancing in school but I think that we can allow the bubbles to become a little bigger outside. Therefore, after half term the infants will be able to play with each other outside, Year 5 and 6 can mix and Year 3 and 4. They will eat in three sittings in the hall although we will still keep them separate inside. A step in the right direction.

Thank you for your responses to the Relationships questionnaire. The majority of parents were in favour of the language being used set out in the document and supportive of the policy. Governors adopted the policy on Tuesday evening. The physical changes part of the curriculum will always be taught in the summer term. A parent handout detailing the content to be covered will be issued ahead of the lessons so parents can withdraw their children if they wish after they are clear about what is to be covered in that year group. We will be organising an online safety session for parents too.

Thank you to for your responses to the uniform questionnaire too. Governors are meeting again on Tuesday evening to make decisions based on your responses. I will let you know on Wednesday what is decided.
