The theme this week from the gospel is Choices. She will have new skills, new knowledge and new ideas that she can bring to our school and I know that you will support her in the choices she makes just as you have supported me.

Sparkle Bean Charity

You will recall that a primary school in our cluster, Tarleton Primary, lost a child to the MEN bombing in May 2017. Saffie Rose. Mr Upton the headteacher there has set up a charity to help schools when terrible things like this happen. It is called the Sparkle Bean charity. The charity supports schools in two ways following the sudden death of a primary aged pupil. Firstly, through sharing learning.
